FEMA Reimbursement for Bass Lake Park

Parking Lot Emergency Protective Measures	\$6,266.01
Repairs to the Building	\$17,534.44
Lake Trail Repair	\$14,963.90
Parking Lot Permanent Repair	\$157,289.00
TOTAL	\$196,053.35

As of 7/28/2017 FEMA will reimburse Bass Lake Park \$196,053.35 for repairs of damage caused as a result of Hurricane Matthew. This reimbursement covers all the costs that the Town has incurred thus far, and also for construction costs for the parking lot, that has yet to be performed.

The last project at Bass Lake Park that FEMA is still working on, is the review of the stream channel. Upon their conclusion, we will learn to what degree they will reimburse the Town for the needed repairs. Once this is established, a schedule of repair for both the parking lot and the stream channel will be worked out and this will conclude the repair of damages sustained from Hurricane Matthew last October. All work will need to be finished by April 10, 2018.
