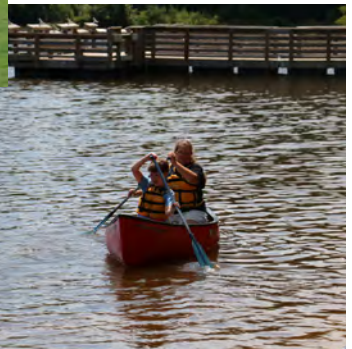
Holly Springs Parks & Recreation is excited to serve you with safe, fun, and affordable adventures for your children in summer 2021!

Nature Explorer Camps

Bass Lake Park Ages 8-13

Summer camp is designed to extend park programs that are offered throughout the year. Fishing basics, taught as a four-hour class is extended throughout the week to give a young angler plenty of opportunity to develop their fishing skills. Archery 101 and 202 teaches safety and proper form to allow a young archer plenty of time to develop new skills. Summer camp archers can sign up for Archery 202 after camp to continue developing their skills. Canoeing basics begins with a boating safety presentation covering weather, clothing and trip preparation. Basic canoe strokes are reinforced along with safe, age appropriate personal rescue techniques including controlled capsizes. All campers need to bring a change of clothes including a towel and water shoes, no flip flops. Campers will also need to bring a non-refrigerated lunch, water bottle, and snacks; snacks will not be provided. Parents will need to check their campers in on Monday to complete forms and waivers. If a camper needs to leave camp early, or will not attend camp on a certain date, please communicate this to camp staff as soon as possible.

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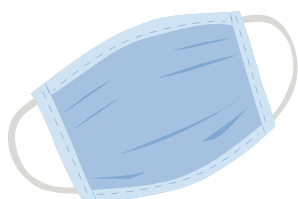
COVID-19 Guidelines for Camp

Camp Staff Responsibilities:

- Employees will adhere to the guidelines as established in the Holly Springs Parks and Recreation COVID-19 Personnel Procedures.
- Perform self-screening health assessment before reporting to work. If employee has experienced COVID-19 symptoms, notify supervisor and do not report to work.
- Supervisors will check in at arrival to confirm self-screenings and take employees temperature using a touchless thermometer. Employees with a fever will be excluded from working camp and sent home. Fever is determined by a thermometer reading of 100.4 or higher.
- Wear a face mask when interacting with participants and parents. Follow CDC guidance for wearing face coverings.
- Be alert to children that aren't feeling well.
- Instruct participants on proper hand washing/hygiene techniques. WASH HANDS OFTEN.
- Sanitize hard surfaces and high touch areas frequently. Tables and chairs will be cleaned and sanitized before and after each meal.

Camp Procedures:

- Camps will operate with reduced staff to camper ratios to allow for spacing within facilities and social distance.
- Per Executive Order 180, participants are required to wear a face covering.
- Groups will remain separate for activities and meals to limit the mixing of participants.
- Where possible, camp activities will be modified to allow for social distance.
- No large group assemblies or field trips will be permitted.
- Camp facilities will be equipped with enough tables and chairs to allow for campers to maintain physical distance.
- When possible, use of shared supplies will be minimized and individual supplies/items will be provided and labeled for participants. Shared supplies and equipment will be cleaned and disinfected after each use.
- Participants are asked to provide their own lunch, drinks, water bottles, face covering and other personal items. Water fountains will not be accessible. Snacks provided by Holly Springs Parks & Recreation will be prepackaged and distributed by staff individually.
- Camp staff will follow NCDHHS guidance for cleaning and disinfection protocol.
- Participants or staff members exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms will be isolated from other participants and required to go home as soon as possible. Individuals who are sick or believe they might be sick will be excluded from camp until they can answer YES to the following questions:
 - Has it been at least 10 days since you first had symptoms?
 - Have you been without fever for three days (72 hours) without any medication for fever?
 - Has it been three days (72) hours since your symptoms have improved?



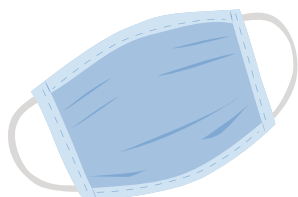
COVID-19 Guidelines for Camp

If a child or staff member presents symptoms of COVID-19 at Summer Camp:

- If a camper presents non-life-threatening symptoms (such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath) of COVID-19, he/she will be calmly yet immediately isolated in a separate space away from other campers. The camper will be provided a face covering to wear, if tolerated. The camper's parent/guardian will be contacted and required to pick up their child within 60 minutes of making contact. If a child's symptoms are life threatening, staff will contact EMS and the camper's parent, and follow directives given by EMS.
- In situations where a camper presents COVID-19 symptoms, the camper's family should have the camper properly tested for the coronavirus. The camper will not be permitted to return to the program until meeting CDC guidelines for re-admittance. Pro-rated camps fees will be refunded.
- All parents/guardians of that camp will receive same-day notification that a child in the program presented COVID-19 symptoms. Families will be encouraged to closely monitor their child(ren)'s health for possible development of COVID-19 symptoms. Personal information about the child will not be shared. Staff will follow cleaning/sanitizing protocols. Program operations will continue unless otherwise directed.
- If a staff member presents non-life-threatening symptoms of COVID-19 he/she will be sent home immediately. If the staff member presents life threatening symptoms, EMS will be contacted and the staff member will be isolated. In all situations where a staff member presents COVID-19 symptoms, he/she will be advised to obtain a coronavirus test. He/she will not be permitted to return to work until meeting the CDC guidelines for returning to work.
- All parents/guardians will receive same-day notification that a staff member presented COVID-19 symptoms. Families will be encouraged to closely monitor their camper's health for possible development of COVID-19 symptoms. Personal information about the staff member will not be shared. Staff will follow cleaning/sanitizing protocols. Program operations will continue unless otherwise directed

If a child or staff member tests positive for the coronavirus

- Upon receiving notification of a positive test, the Facility Manager will immediately contact the Department Director, Town Manager's Office and the NC Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) to handle contact tracing and next steps. All parents/guardians will receive same-day notification should a staff member or child test positive for the coronavirus.
- The Department will follow all required steps issued from the NCDHHS regarding necessary facility closures for proper facility cleaning and additional testing prior to re-opening the facility location.



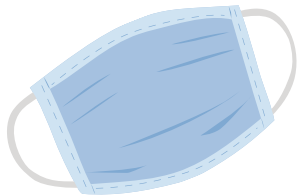
COVID-19 Guidelines for Camp

Drop Off/Arrival Protocol:

- A designated camp staff member will greet participants outside as they arrive. Staff will monitor and discourage congregation at check in. At the end of the day, camp staff will escort participants to their cars for pick up.
- Upon arrival, camp staff will conduct a health screening on all participants. Staff will ask parents the following questions:
 - Do you or any of the children you are dropping off have a fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea?
 - Have you or any of the children you are dropping off:
 - Had any symptoms since the last time you were here?
 - Been in contact with anyone with fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea since the last time you were here?
 - Potentially been exposed to COVID-19 or have reason to believe you/they have COVID-19?
- Camp staff will take the temperature of participants using a touchless thermometer. Participants with a fever will be excluded from attending camp. Fever is determined by a thermometer reading of 100.4 or higher.

This protocol is based on the NCDHSS Guidance for Day Camp Settings.

REFUND POLICY

100% refund/transfer if Department cancels program. Parks & Recreation continues to offer a liberal refund policy in regard to COVID-19.

Hunt Recreation Center Summer Camp

Refund/transfer requests must be submitted in writing to the appropriate Programs Manager by June 14. Refunds requested after June 14 will not be refunded. A \$15 service charge will be assessed per child/per week for all refunds.

Bass Lake Camps & Holly Springs Cultural Center Camps

Refund/transfer requests must be submitted in writing to the appropriate Programs Manager at least 14 days prior to the start of the camp the participant is registered for. Refunds requested less than 14 days prior to the camp in which the participant is enrolled will not be refunded. A \$15 service charge will be assessed per child/per week for all refunds.

NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

The Town of Holly Springs Parks & Recreation Department does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation or disability in employment opportunities or the provision of service, programs or activities.

LUNCHES/SNACKS

Each child is responsible for providing their own nutritious lunch/snack including a drink to camp daily. A microwave is not available for camp use.

CLOTHES

Children should dress appropriately for camp. Play clothes that can get dirty, with sneakers/gym shoes and socks are required. No sandals or bare feet allowed.

PHOTOGRAPHY WAIVER

Pictures of your child may be taken while participating in Town activities and may be used for program publicity.

BASIC FACILITY RULES

- No running inside facilities.
- Campers will not be allowed to use telephones.
- Do not interfere with another group's activity.
- When working on arts and crafts, maintain a clean work area and take home your projects daily.
- Foul and abusive language toward counselors or other campers will not be tolerated.
- Make sure borrowed supplies are returned at the end of the day.
- No eating or drinking except in designated areas.
- Do not bring toys, games, or devices to camp except on designated technology days.
- Campers should not bring money with them unless given permission to do so. Parks & Recreation Staff are not responsible for money brought by campers
- No street shoes allowed.

SICK CHILDREN

Participants are required to conduct a self-health assessment prior to attending any activity. Individuals experiencing COVID-19 related symptoms and/or fever should refrain from attending. Temperature screenings may be administered by staff for admittance to camp activities. For more information about COVID-19 operations, see pages 1-3.

If a camper is not feeling well enough to participate in the summer camp program, the child should stay home. Any child who has the following symptoms within a 24-hour period is not permitted to attend the program:

- Temperature over 100
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Eye irritation
- Sore Throat
- Rash

If a camper becomes sick while at camp, the child's parent/guardian will be asked to pick up their child. If the parent/guardian cannot be reached the emergency contact will be called.

DROP-OFF & PICK-UP

Please review the modified drop-off & pick-up policies on page 3. If someone other than the child's guardian will be picking them up, let the camp counselor know in writing that morning.

LOST ITEMS

Town of Holly Springs Parks & Recreation Department is not responsible for any personal items lost or stolen at our programs.

OUTINGS

Some camps may allow field trips if COVID-19 conditions allow. A blanket permission form on the Registration Application must be signed in order for your child to participate in field trips. You will be given a list of planned trips in advance. Verbal consent will not be accepted as permission.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

The Holly Springs Parks & Recreation Staff are dedicated to a discipline policy that is neither humiliating nor degrading. The town reserves the right to remove a child from the program at any time. The following is a guide in redirecting disruptive behavior.

Step 1: Warning/Reminders

We remind the child of the rule they have broken and tell them what the consequences will be if it continues.

Step 2: Withdrawal of privileges

The child will lose time from a fun activity. Example: He/she will lose 10 minutes from free time.

Step 3: Written Warning

The child's counselor will send a note home which will explain to the parent/guardian the rule that was broken. It must be signed by the child's parent/guardian and turned in when they return the next day.

Step 4: Expulsion from Camp

If a child continues to break the rules the parent/guardian will be asked to meet with the child's counselors to discuss other ways to help guide their child toward positive behavior. The Program reserves the right to dismiss any child from the Program who is harmful or a threat to the wellbeing of other children or staff.
